September 8th 2021

Meeting began at 6:37pm with a prayer led by Jacki Amato

Greg Kondilas, HSA President, introduced the HAS Board members

- Stated we had room for addition board members and people should see him after the meeting if they were interested.
- He also reminded parents to sign in before leaving so that their student(s) would receive a dress down pass.

Principal's Report – Mr. Paul Kristoff

- stated that the school year is off to a great start and that everyone is excited to have all the students back in the building this year.
- Current enrollment is around 292 students.
- The school is trying to be careful and conservative when it comes to making decisions for the school. Deep cleaning takes place every evening and the school was sprayed by Vytas Shield: a protective coating that prevents viruses and bacteria from living on surfaces. All classrooms have air filters and ultraviolet rays that scrub and clean the air. They are also trying to get the kids outside as often as possible.
- Upgrades were made to the classrooms over the summer. The closet doors were removed in the classrooms and book shelves were added for nicer storage in the rooms.
- Exterior doors to Laboure were replaced and the doors leading into the gym from the hallway will be replaced in the future. This was paid for by a \$48,000 security grant.
- Knott grant was applied for to upgrade technology.
- Music teacher starts on Monday. Choir will be back as will drama.
- We're waiting to hear back from the company that provides our instrumental program.
- New tech teacher also started this week.
- Mr. Kristoff talked about the Volunteer Hours requirement and that the intent was to encourage more parents to be involved with school activities. Involvement can mean helping with an activity or helping with a mailing.
- Mask policy is set by the Archdiocese of Baltimore and is based on the number of cases per 100,000 in the county. When the number of cases is 7.1 or below parents will have the option of requiring their children to be masked in school. An email will be sent every Sunday stating the mask policy for that week.
- Mr. Kristoff thanked parents for being diligent and keeping their kids home when they were even slightly ill. This cautious, conservative approach kept the school running last year and he thanked parents in advance for there continued diligence this year.

Vice-Prinicipal's Report – Ms. Godlewski

Lunches this year are free and ordering needs to be done first thing in the morning.

- School planners were already paid for with your book bill. So no additional charge is due for the planners.
- Students should be in full uniform this year and gym uniform on gym days. If the regular uniform isn't in, students may wear their gym uniform until all their pieces are in.

 - Please do not stop in the middle of Madeleine Ave. pull over to the curb. When arriving or departing, please do so quickly, so that the next set of cars can pull up.
 - o 7th & 8th grade safeties will be utilized in the very near future.
 - Appreciate your patience it is a work in progress.
