





We will be using the website www.ixl.com to personalize learning for all students. Your child's username and password is attached and instructions are below.

IXL creates personalized learning with a comprehensive Math and Language Arts curriculum. It provides individualized guidance and real-time analytics. IXL can meet the unique needs of each learner.

Log on to IXL using your username and password that are attached to this letter.

To get your child started on your home computer, please follow these easy steps:

- ★ Go to <https://www.ixl.com>
- ★ Enter your child's username and password (see attached) and click "Sign in."

- ★ Click on the grade your child has just completed and practice skills in math and ELA. Math skills should include all four operations with whole numbers, place value, and fractions.
- ★ ELA skills should focus on grammar as well as reading comprehension.
- ★ Students should strive for a score of at least 80% for each skill they complete.

New Students who are coming to STMSTC for the first time:

Please email Mrs. Latkowsky at platkowsky@stmstc.org and she will set up an account for your child and email you their username and password. Once you have that, follow the instructions above to get your child started on IXL.

IXL is designed to help your child learn at their own pace. The program is adaptive and will adjust based on your child's demonstrated understanding of the material. All of your child's results will be saved, so you can monitor their progress anytime by clicking on Analytics. For on-the-go practice, you can download IXL's free mobile apps for Apple, Android, or Kindle and sign in with your child's username and password.

In addition to practicing skills on ixl.com, incoming sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students are required to read one book of their choice. The novel may be of any genre/type, but it must be age and grade appropriate. You do not have to do any work with the book over the summer except read it. Please have it read by the time school starts in August.
